

THE ENS SIGN: IT CAN SAVE A LIFE!

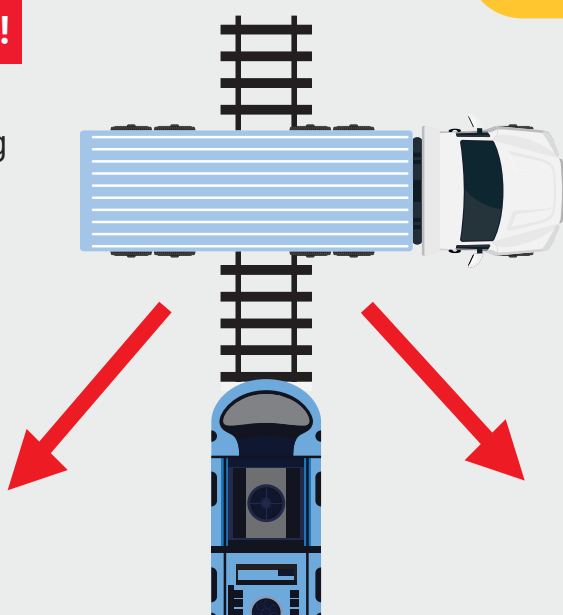
You know how it goes. You're on a run and no matter how much you plan, something unexpected happens. If your truck gets stuck or stalls on railroad tracks, what do you do?

Follow these steps to help stop a track tragedy from happening:

- 1. First, get out of your rig and away from the tracks** immediately— whether or not you see a train coming.
- 2. From a safe distance, at least 15 feet from the nearest rail, find the blue and white Emergency Notification System (ENS) sign.** It will be on or near the crossbuck.
- 3. Each sign has a unique emergency phone number and crossing ID.** These numbers will be different at every crossing.
- 4. Call the emergency phone number** and tell the operator the crossing ID where you are located. **No sign? Call 911.**
- 5. While maintaining a safe distance, make any additional calls as your company supervisor or dispatch requires.**

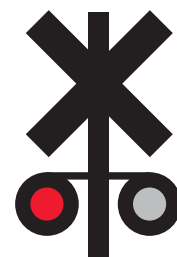
IF A TRAIN IS COMING, GET OUT IMMEDIATELY!

Run toward the oncoming train and away from the track at a 45-degree angle to avoid debris.
