

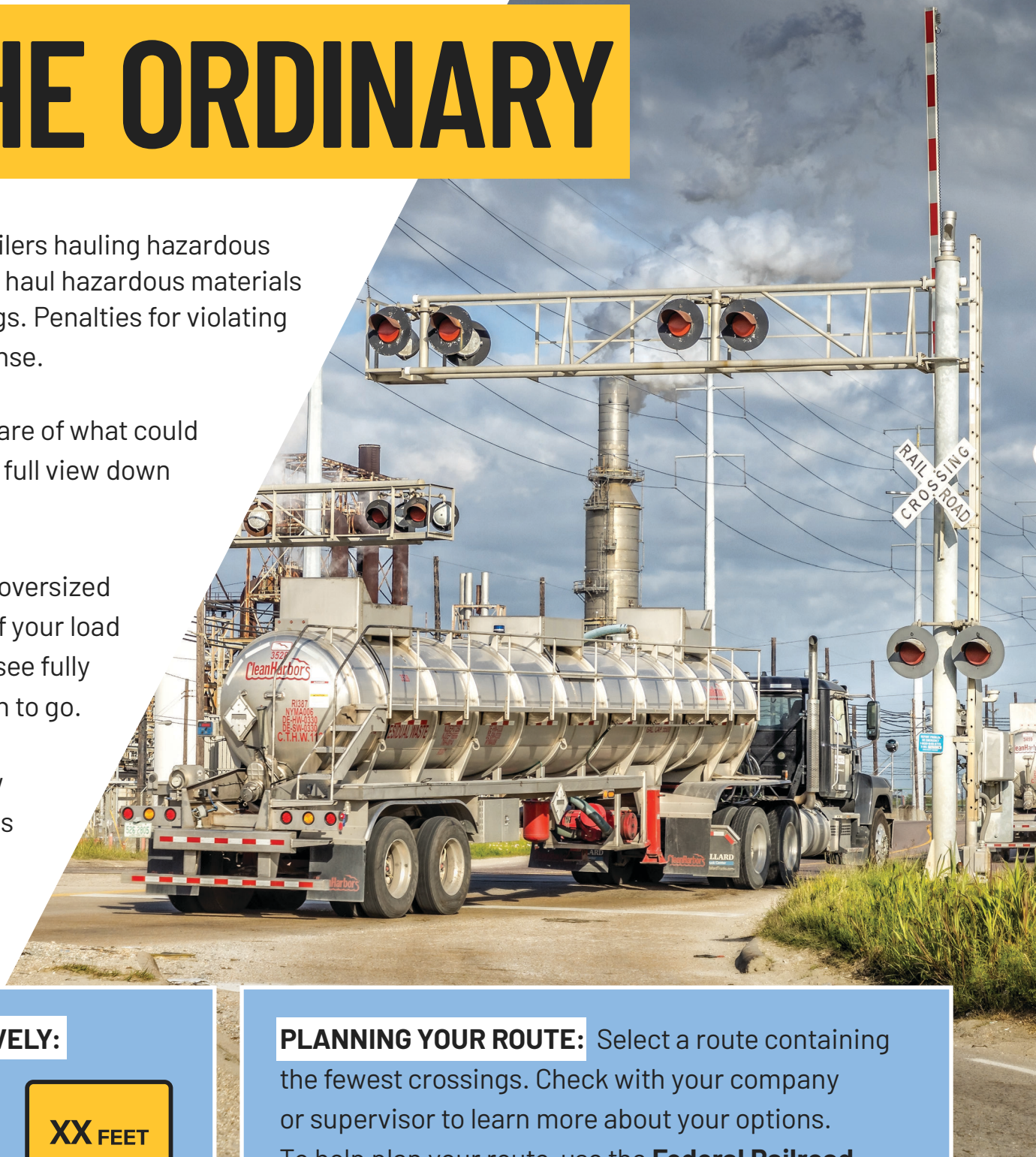
OUT OF THE ORDINARY

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS: Trucks and trailers hauling hazardous materials and even empty tankers used to haul hazardous materials are required to stop at all railroad crossings. Penalties for violating driving rules may result in losing your license.

OBSTRUCTED VIEW: While driving, be aware of what could obstruct your view. Look and lean to get a full view down the tracks in both directions.

OVERSIZED VEHICLE: If you're driving an oversized vehicle be sure that the extended length of your load will fully clear tracks, and ensure you can see fully down the track before making the decision to go.

OFFICER OR FLAGGER: If a uniformed law enforcement officer or an official flagger is present at a crossing directing traffic, follow their directions.



USE STORAGE SPACE SIGNS EFFECTIVELY:

If you're entering a highway near a crossing, you may see a storage space sign. These signs will indicate how many feet are present between train tracks and highway. **If you don't fit, don't commit.**

PLANNING YOUR ROUTE: Select a route containing the fewest crossings. Check with your company or supervisor to learn more about your options. To help plan your route, use the **Federal Railroad Administration's Crossing Locator app** as a guide to see crossings along your route. Do this *before* driving, when planning and reviewing your route.

IN AN EMERGENCY?

If you're stalled on the tracks or to report an emergency, safely find the rectangular blue and white Emergency Notification System (ENS) sign, call the emergency number and give them the unique crossing ID number. No ENS sign? Call 911. Always stay a safe distance back when making phone calls.
