

# RISC LE & FF requirements and process:

#### **RISC LE-Instructor:**

- Minimum 2 Years Training or Instructing Experience
  - INSTRUCTOR EXPERIENCE is defined as:
    - Following an agenda
    - Stating goals and objectives
    - Facilitating learning using established lesson plans and engagement modules
    - Administering and interpreting assessments
- Minimum 2 Years Law Enforcement or Railroad Experience
  - MUST NOT be more than three years removed from either Law Enforcement or Railroad Experience.
- If no Law Enforcement or Railroad Experience:
  - Must have Instructor experience.
  - Must have a recommendation letter of support from OL State Coordinator (uploaded to online Instructor Application) If applicant is a State Coordinator, must have letter of support from State Coordinator Regional Representative.
  - Must provide work resume that highlights instructor experience (uploaded to online Instructor Application)

### All accepted Applicants will:

- Attend and successfully complete a multi-day Instructor Course to include ten-minute teach back lesson.
- Complete online Operation Lifesaver Authorized Volunteer (OLAV) online training session

#### **Special Considerations for RISC Instructors**

In some cases, instructor applicants may be eligible to teach cross-curricular: Law Enforcement Instructors may be designated as **hybrid instructors**, those who can teach <u>both</u> RISC for Firefighter and RISC for Law Enforcement. When needed and where appropriate, the RISC Consultant will make this designation for those applicants with a background in <u>both</u> law enforcement and railroad (example: railroad police) Training is conducted:

- 1. During a RISC LE Class (as an additional module)
  OR
- 2. After a class via webinar (scheduled and offered as needed with approval of RISC Instructor and OLI staff). These webinars are held on a case-by-case basis and will only be offered to those with prior approval.

RISC Requirements, October 2025

<sup>\*</sup>Instructors approved using this requirement **must** co-instruct with a Law Enforcement or Railroad Instructor

### **RISC FF-Instructor:**

- Minimum 2 Years Training or Instructing Experience
  - INSTRUCTOR EXPERIENCE is defined as:
    - Following an agenda
    - Stating goals and objectives
    - Facilitating learning through the use of established lesson plans and engagement modules
    - Administering and interpreting assessments
- Minimum 3 Years Career Firefighter or 5 Years Volunteer Firefighter or 2 Years of Railroad Experience
  - MUST NOT be more than three years removed from either Firefighter or Railroad Experience
- If no Firefighting or Railroad Experience:
  - Must have Instructor experience.
  - MUST have a recommendation letter of support from OLI State Coordinator (uploaded to online Instructor Application) If applicant is a State Coordinator, must have letter of support from State Coordinator Regional Representative (SCRR)
  - Must provide work resume that highlights instructor experience (uploaded to online Instructor Application)

All accepted Applicants will:

- Attend and successfully complete a multi-day Instructor Course to include ten-minute teach back lesson
- Complete online Operation Lifesaver Authorized Volunteer (OLAV) online training session

### **RISC LE INSTRUCTOR TRAINER:**

- Must meet all the above requirements as a RISC LE Instructor
- Taught a minimum of 8 RISC classes with at least 2 as the lead instructor.
  - LEAD INSTRUCTOR is defined as the instructor responsible for coordinating the logistics of the class including:
    - Contact host organization/agency to confirm time, date, location, room set up and technical equipment. Responsible for contacting RISC Consultant and State Coordinator to review class details.
    - Outlining lesson plan for co-instructor
    - Orders materials and supplies from authorized OLI printer
    - Responsible for submitting report at oli.org and submitting evaluations and rosters to RISC Consultant, as well as following up with State Coordinator.
  - This must be during the 2 previous years (no older classes will count) of date of application.
  - Be willing to submit class rosters and evaluation sheets from previous courses taught.
- Attend and successfully complete a multi-day Instructor-Trainer course to include a 20-minute teach-back lesson.

\*Those with no law enforcement or no railroad experience will not be considered applicants

<sup>\*</sup>Instructors approved using this requirement **must** co-instruct with a Law Enforcement or Railroad Instructor

### for Instructor-Trainers.

#### **RISC FF INSTRUCTOR TRAINER:**

- Must meet all above requirements as a RISC FF Instructor
- Taught a minimum of 8 RISC classes with at least 2 as the lead instructor.
  - LEAD INSTRUCTOR is defined as the instructor responsible for coordinating the logistics of the class including:
    - Contact host organization/agency to confirm time, date, location, room set up and technical equipment. Responsible for contacting RISC Consultant and State Coordinator to review class details.
    - Outlining lesson plan for co-instructor
    - Orders materials and supplies from authorized OLI printer
    - Responsible for submitting report at oli.org and submitting evaluations and rosters to RISC Consultant, as well as following up with State Coordinator.
  - This must be during the 2 previous years (no older classes will count) of date of application.
  - Be willing to submit class rosters and evaluation sheets from previous courses taught.
- Attend and successfully complete a multi-day Instructor-Trainer course to include a 20minute teach-back lesson.

\*Those with no firefighter or railroad experience will not be considered applicants for Instructor-Trainers.

# Process for applying to be an instructor.

- 1. Applicant reviews criteria and determines s/he is eligible.
- 2. Applicants fill out online application forms including support letters and resumes if required.
  - a. An email is sent to the RISC coordinator and members of the Application Review Committee (ARC). The application review committee reads the application, resume and letter of support.
  - An email is sent to the relevant State Coordinator (name of individual within their state)
     This is the time for a State Coordinator to comment and share their thoughts with the
     RISC Consultant
- 3. Once reviewed an applicant is either 1) declined or 2) accepted to attend a class.
  - a. Declined criteria and/or concerns raised during ARC review.
  - b. Accepted to attend class applicant attends class.
    - Outcome of class attendance is 1) full acceptance as instructor; 2) conditional acceptance as instructor and assigned mentor or 3) not accepted as instructor.
  - Once an applicant is approved, the State Coordinator will receive an automated email
    with the approved instructor's name as well as a confirmation email from the RISC
    Consultant

# Process for leading a RISC LE or RISC FF (all modules and hours):

Classes can be scheduled in two ways:

- 1. Schedule by RISC Consultant
- 2. Schedule by RISC Instructor

# If scheduled by RISC Consultant:

- 1. RISC Consultant emails SC of the state where the class is held and connects the SC with the instructor(s) who will lead the class.
- 2. The State Coordinator should acknowledge a class is offered in their state and confirm with RISC Consultant if they will attend the class to speak on behalf of OLI.
- 3. RISC instructor submits paperwork to the RISC Consultant (class roster, tests and evaluations)

## If Scheduled by RISC Instructor:

- 1. Notify RISC Consultant of class (in advance—8 weeks lead time requested)
- 2. RISC Consultant emails SC of the state where the class is held and connects the SC with the instructor(s) who will lead the class.
- 3. State Coordinator should acknowledge a class is offered in their state and confirm with RISC Consultant if they will attend to speak on behalf of OLI.
- 4. RISC instructor submits paperwork to the RISC Consultant (class roster, tests and evaluations)
